Get the most therapeutic value out of each activity.



Tips for how to direct an activity.

- * Remind yourself that the end product is not a perfect craft or score, but the way to make understanding and awareness happen.
- * Give clear overview of the steps involved to do the activity.
- * Use visual support when possible. (pictures, demonstration, write out steps as you demonstrate the project)
- * Keep distractions to a minimum.
- * Observe to see how much of the activity is understood.
- * Allow for creativity within the parameters of the task. If the details of the craft do not permit a circle to touch another circle than enforce that concept, because attention to details does matter in life.
- * Do not worry if it will look correct when it is finished. Focus on the process not the end result (score or if it looks like you envisioned).
- * Make everything fun. Kids are attracted to what is fun, not what you want done.

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
