# **POSITION: Occupational Therapist**

PAY GRADE: Certified Salary Schedule FLSA STATUS: Exempt

## **POSITION OBJECTIVE:**

The job of Occupational Therapist is done for the purpose/s of assessing students' functional development level; maximizing students' functional level; providing information for program development and student placement; improving students' performance; and providing information on child development and/or issues on specific students to instructional personnel.

**DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES:** (These duties are a representative sample; position assignments may vary.)

- Assesses school site facilities for the purpose of ensuring accessibility in compliance with state and federal regulations.
- Assesses students' fine motor skills and developmental skills (e.g. perceptual-motor, motor coordination, sensory development) for the purpose of determining their deficits and developing recommendations.
- Consults with teachers, parents, other personnel and/or outside professionals for the purpose of providing requested information, developing plans for services and/or making recommendations.
- Facilitates meetings (e.g. IEP conferences, parent meetings, in-services, etc.) for the purpose of developing plans and/or providing information regarding students' functional goals.
- Instructs staff, students and parents for the purpose of implementing plans for remediation of functional limitations.
- Participates in various meetings (e.g. parent conferences, in-service training, site
  meetings, etc.) for the purpose of receiving and/or providing information and/or
  meeting credential requirements.
- Prepares documentation (e.g. evaluations, observances, progress, contacts with parents, teachers and outside professionals, etc.) for the purpose of providing written support, developing recommendations and/or conveying information.
- Presents information on various topics related to professional expertise in occupational therapy for the purpose of communicating information and gaining feedback on treatment issues.
- Researches resources and methods (e.g. intervention and treatment techniques, assessment tools and methods, community resources, etc.) for the purpose of determining the appropriate approach for addressing students' functional goals.
- Screens students for the purpose of determining the need for further individualized assessment.
- Supervises occupational therapy interns from educational programs and assistants for the purpose of providing ongoing collaboration with COTA's.
- Assists other personnel as may be required for the purpose of supporting them in the completion of their work activities.
- Other duties as assigned.

### **POSITION: Occupational Therapist**

### **EDUCATION & EXPERIENCE** (positions in this class typically require):

- Bachelor's degree in Occupational Therapy from accredited program approved by the American Occupational Therapy Association
- NDT training preferred
- Minimum of one year clinical experience, sensory integration and pediatric experience preferred

### **SKILLS** (position requirements at entry):

- Demonstrated expertise in screening, evaluation and diagnosis
- Technical competence in designing and implementing treatment plans
- Good communication skills and ability to work effectively with the community, staff and administration

#### PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS:

Positions in this class typically require: stooping, kneeling, crouching, reaching, standing, walking, pushing, pulling, lifting, finger dexterity, grasping, talking, hearing, seeing, and repetitive motions.

Medium Work: Exerting up to 50 pounds of force occasionally, and/or up to 20 pounds of force frequently, and/or up to 10 pounds of force constantly to move objects.

Incumbents may be subjected to moving mechanical parts, odors, chemicals, extreme temperatures, inadequate lighting, workspace restrictions, and intense noises.
