"Lines: A Tool for Therapy" is a packet with several variations that we hope can be helpful to a wide variety of therapists (Speech & Language, Occupational, and Physical therapists).

Several examples are here below:

Physical Therapist: Just ask your clients to hold the paper and then choose a line and walk in the direction that the line does or do the move at the end of each string. You will find printable pictures on the site and you can cut them out and paste one at the bottom of each string line.

Occupational Therapist: This is a wonderful tool to slow down a fast impulsive writer, or train the visual-perception and visual motor skills. We recommend that you use a dry erase board and draw 2 lines downward (just line on the sheets), then have them erase one with a dry eraser then progress to the "LINES: A Tool for Therapy."

Speech Therapy: We have included articulation versions of this, for initial letters /R/, /TH/, /S/, and /W/ and ending /R/, /TH/, /S/, and /W/. Have your clients follow each line down with a highlighter and say each word they come across. You may opt to have them say the word in a sentence.

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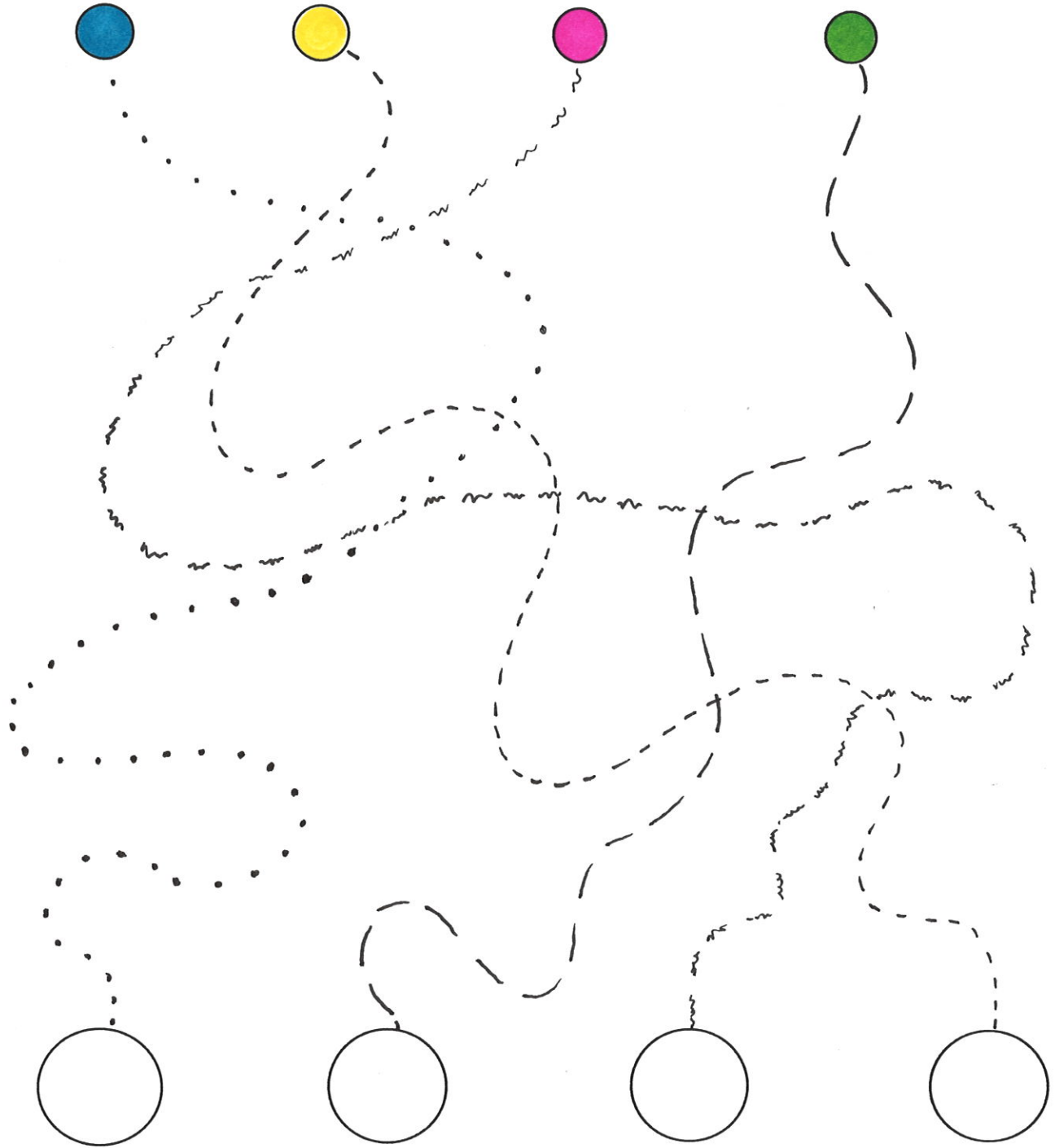
LINES: A Tool for Therapy

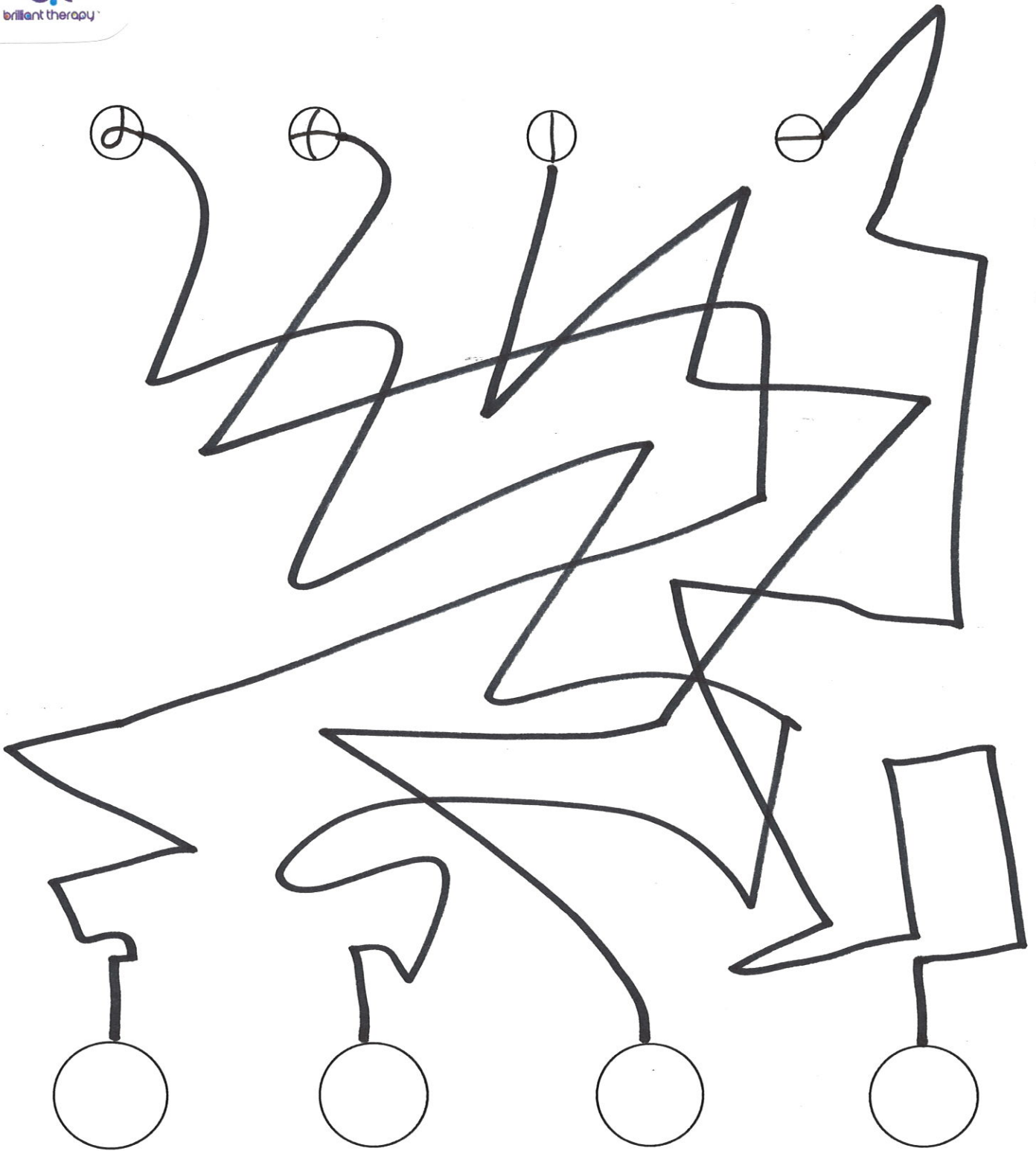

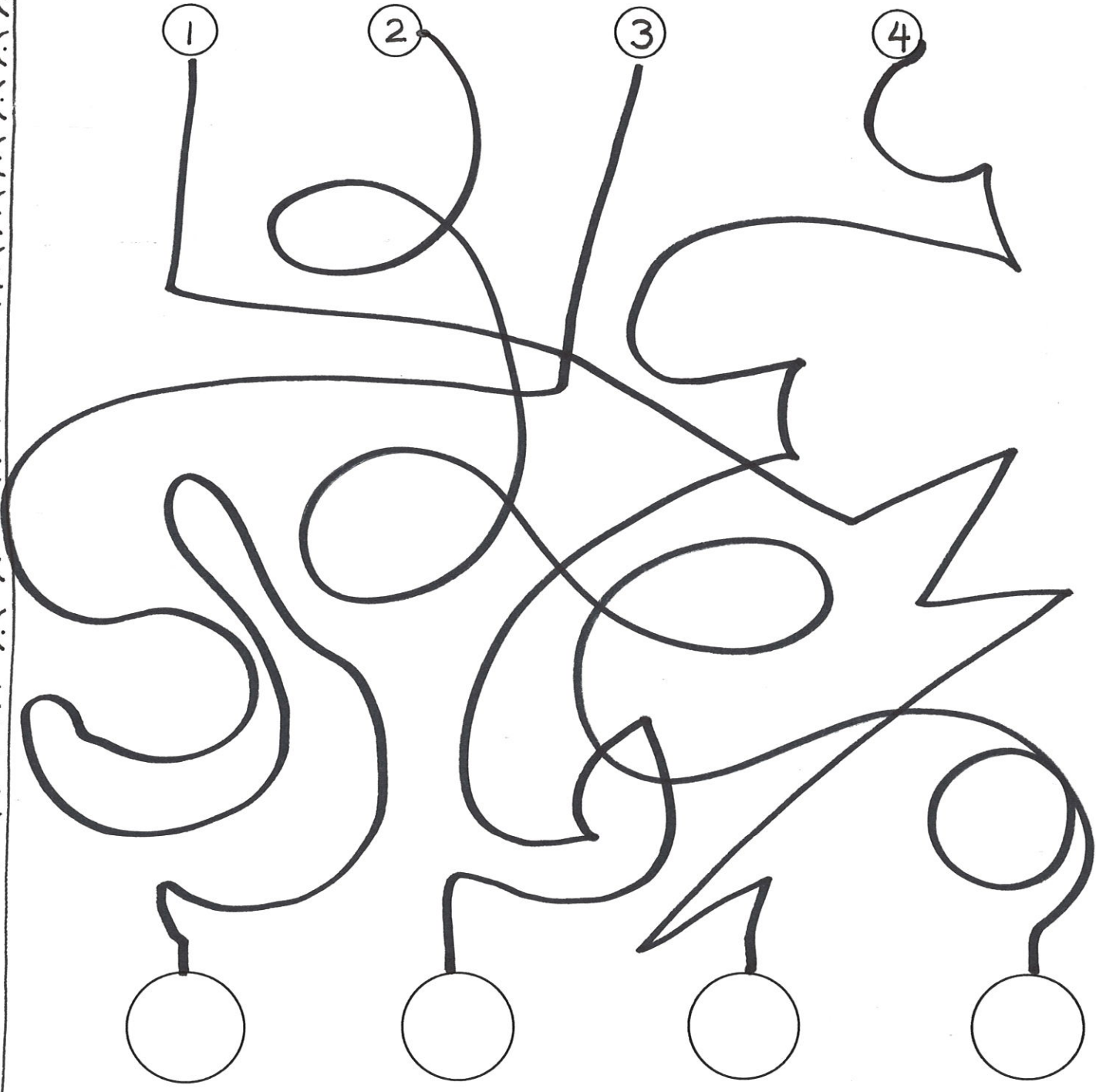


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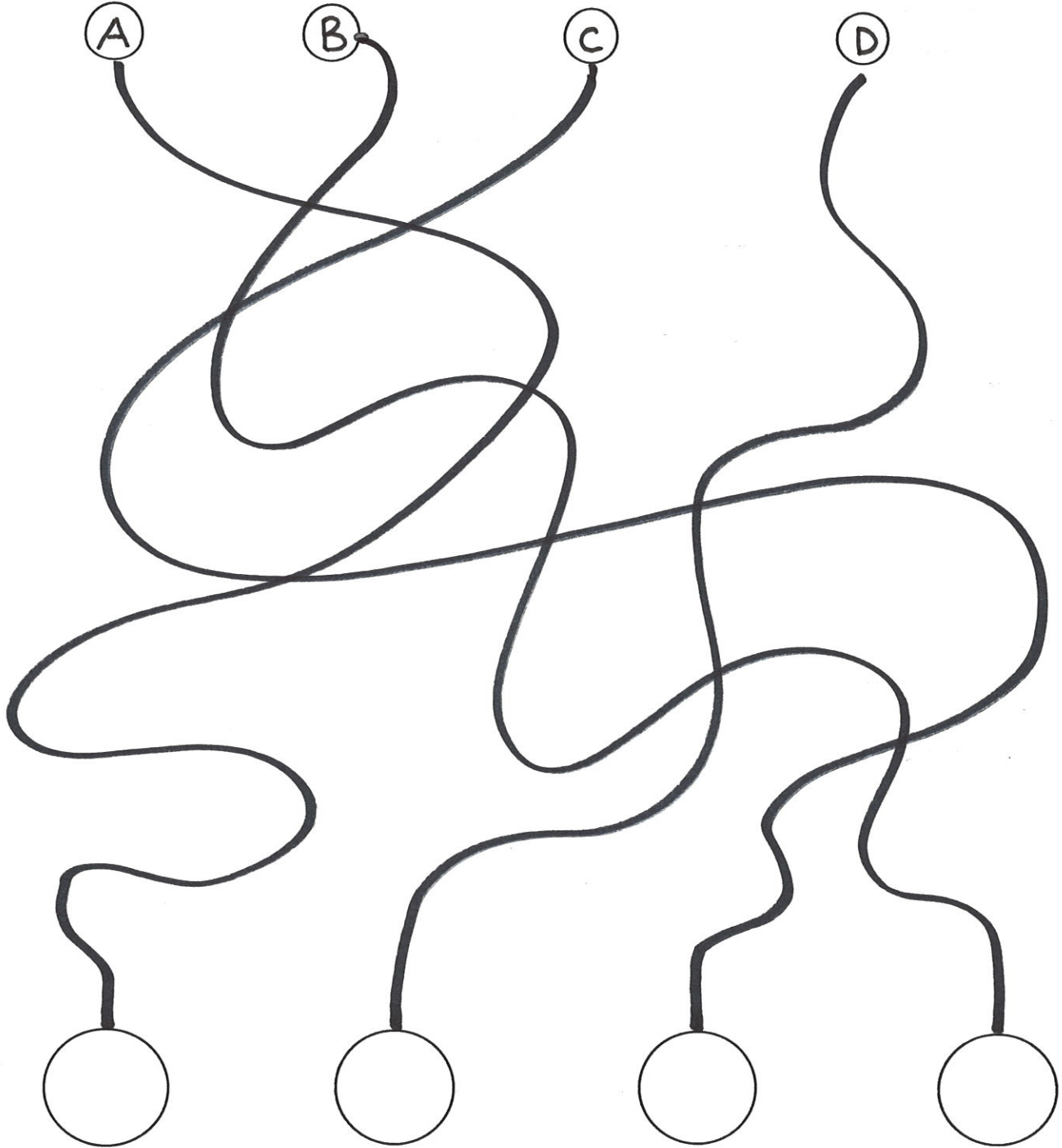




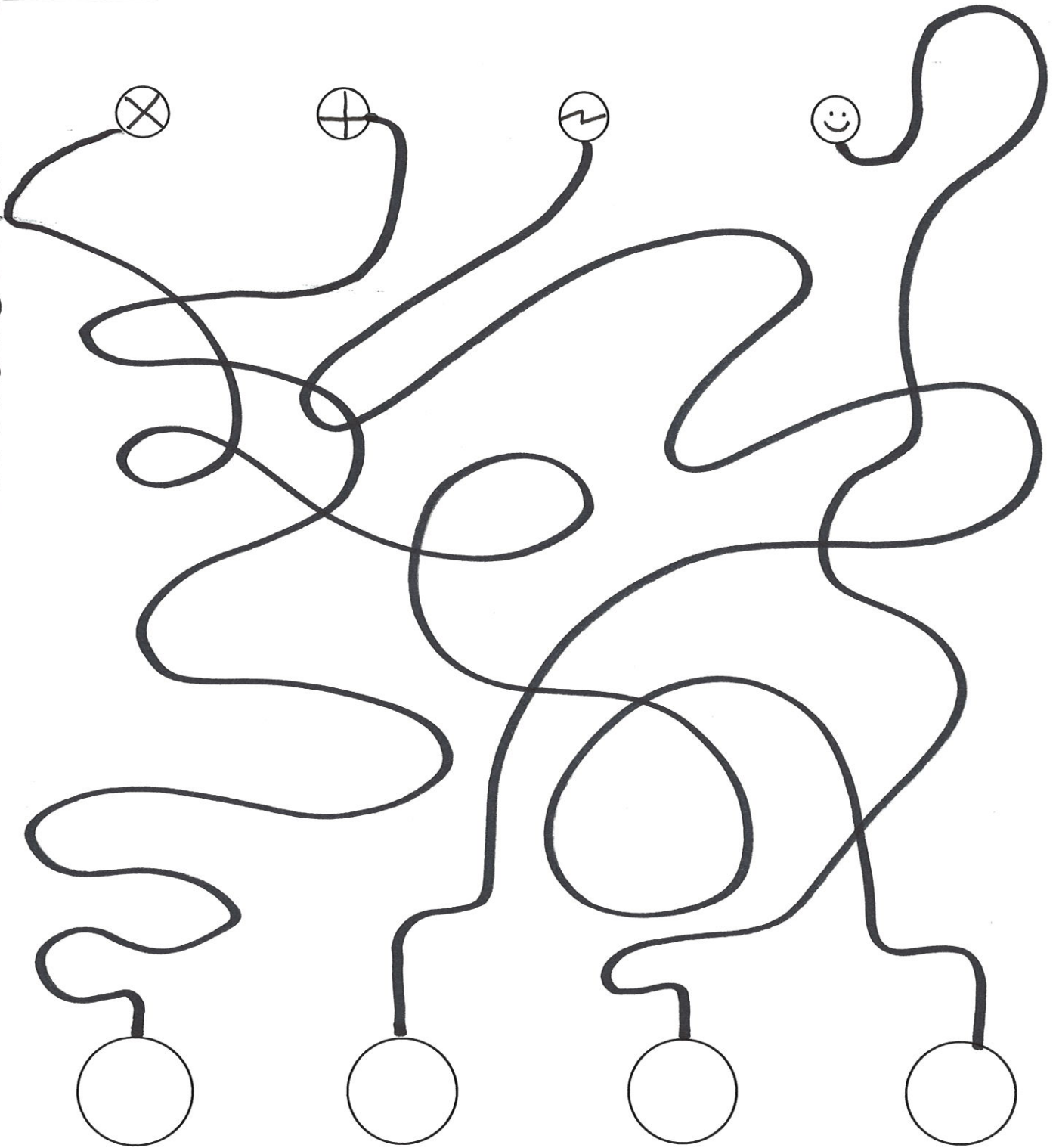
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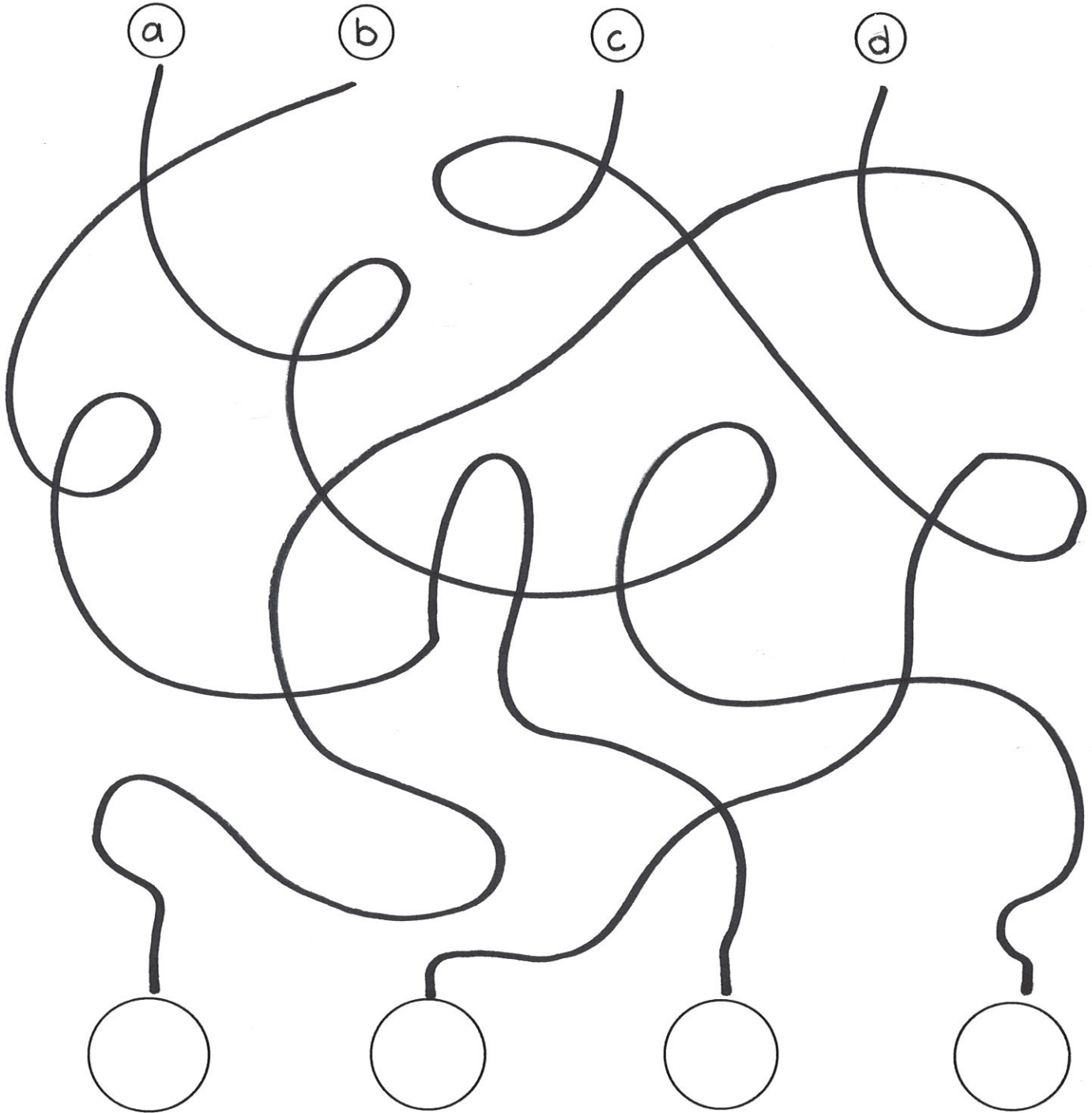
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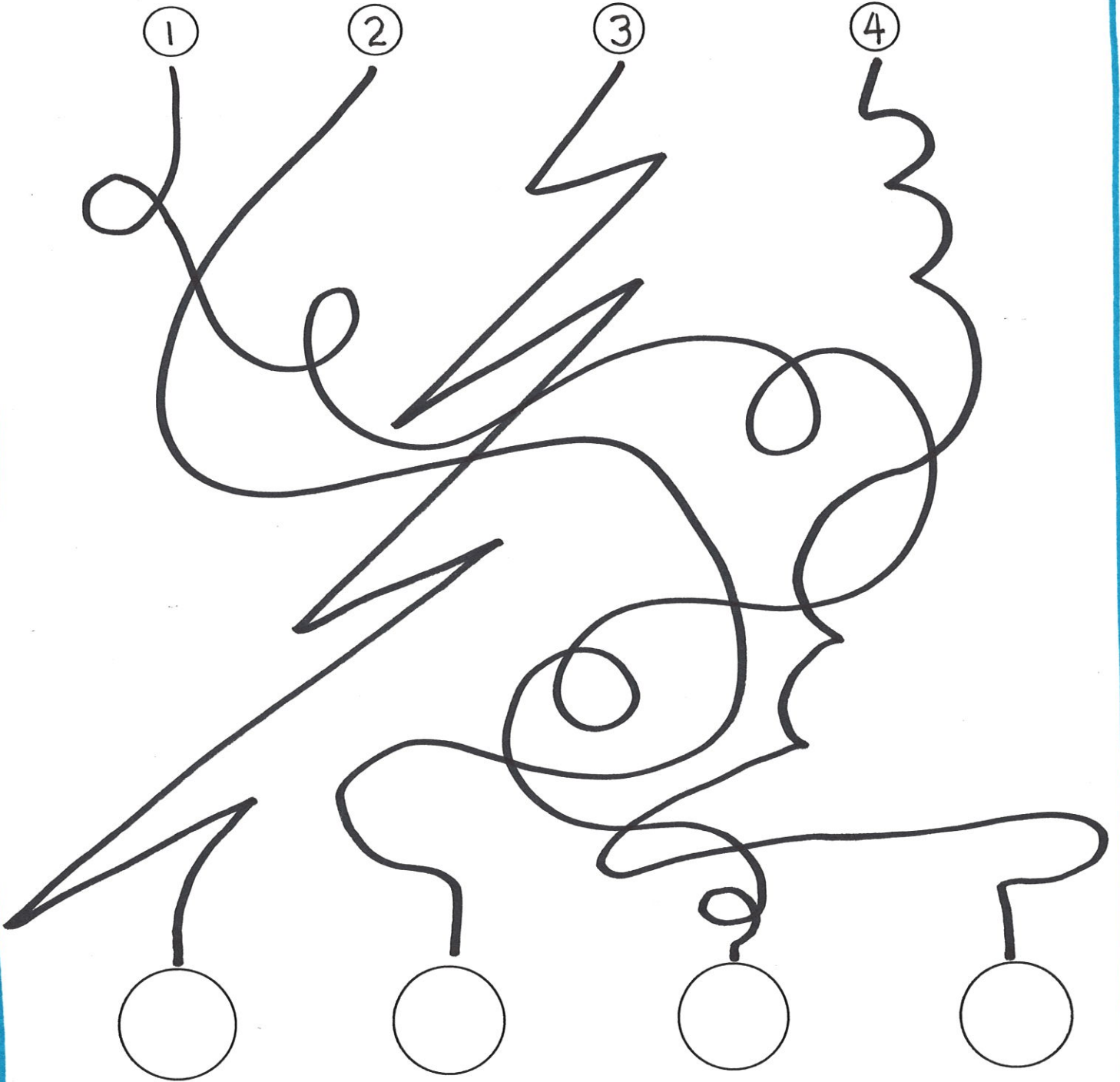
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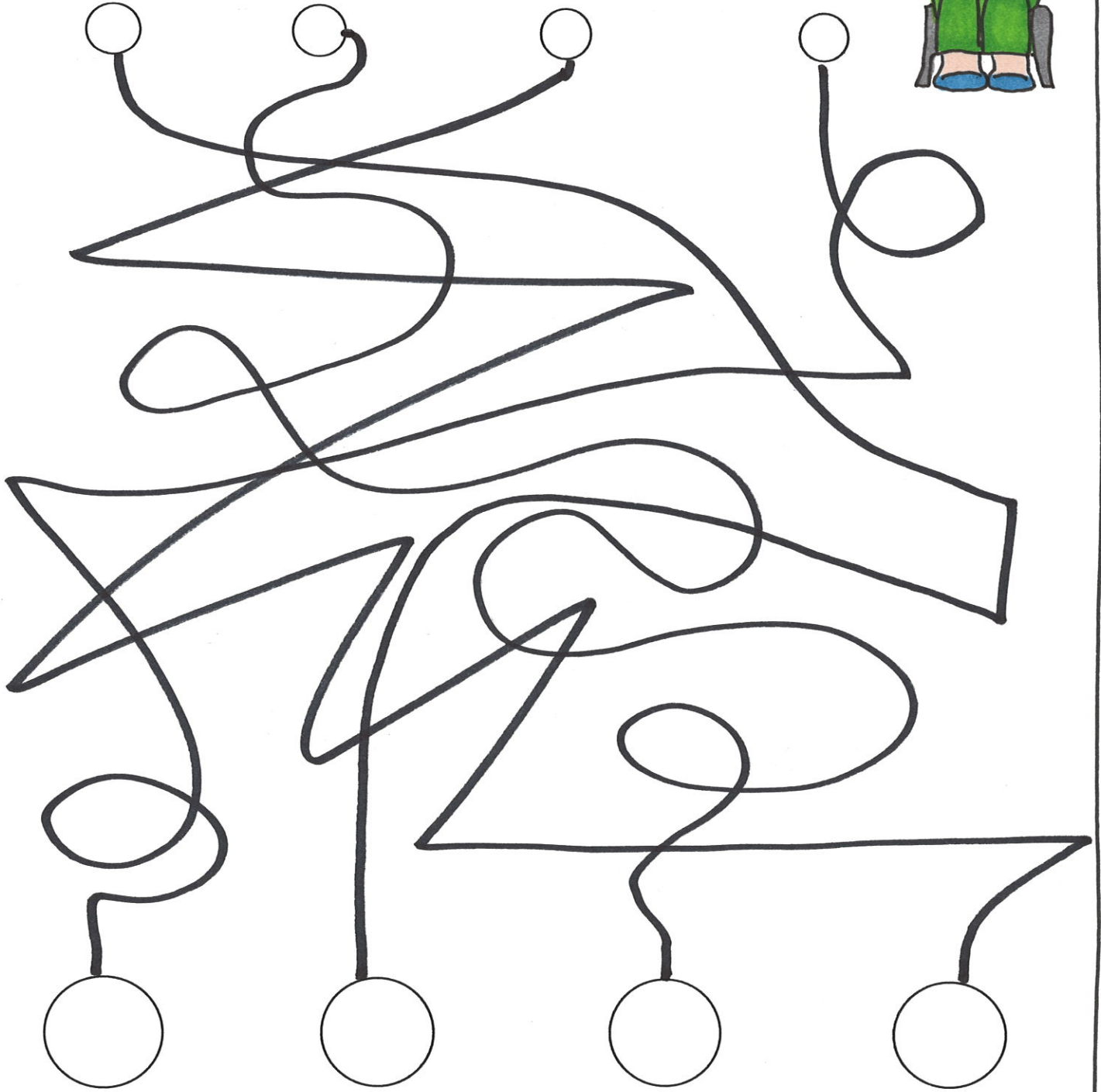
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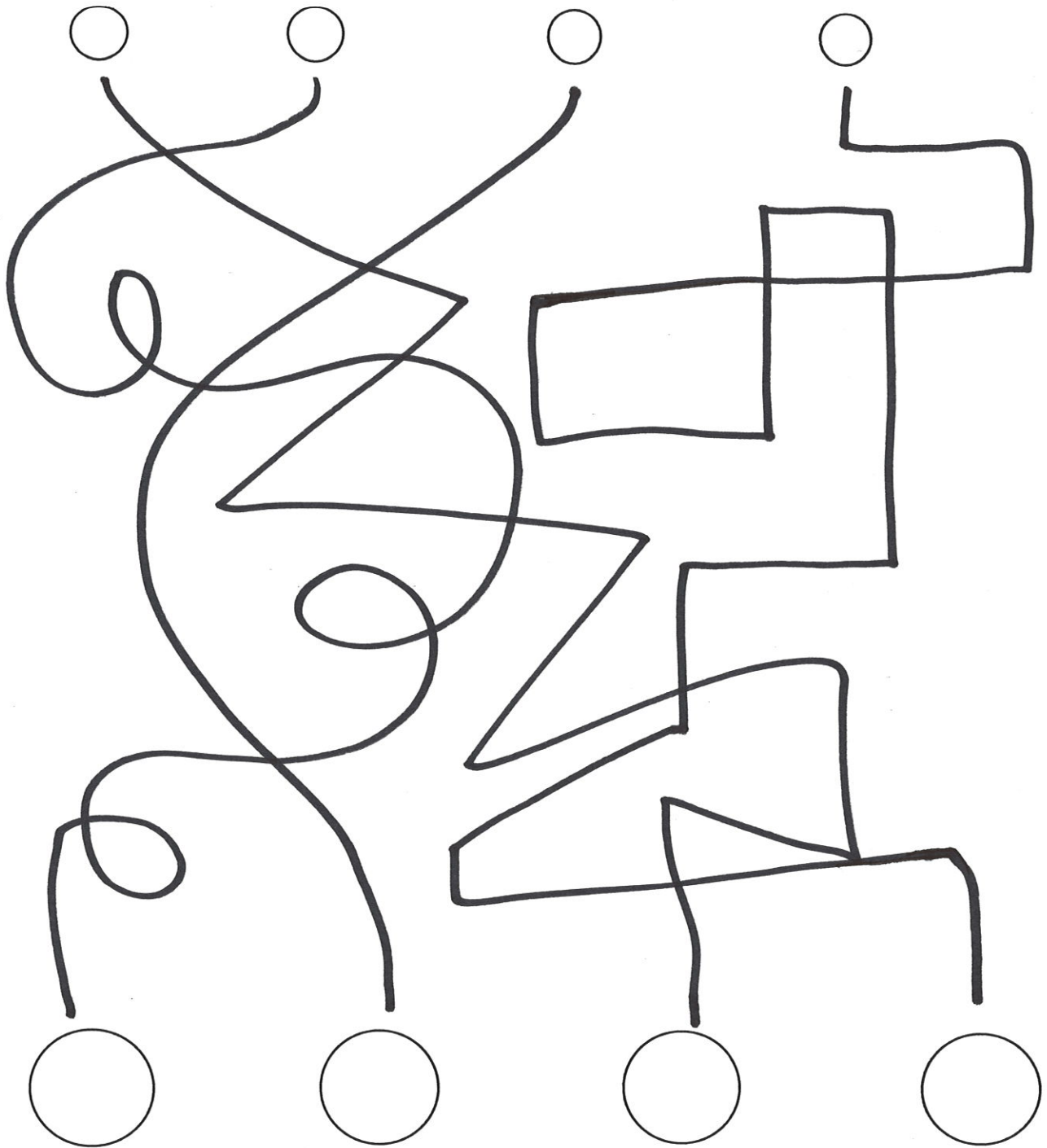
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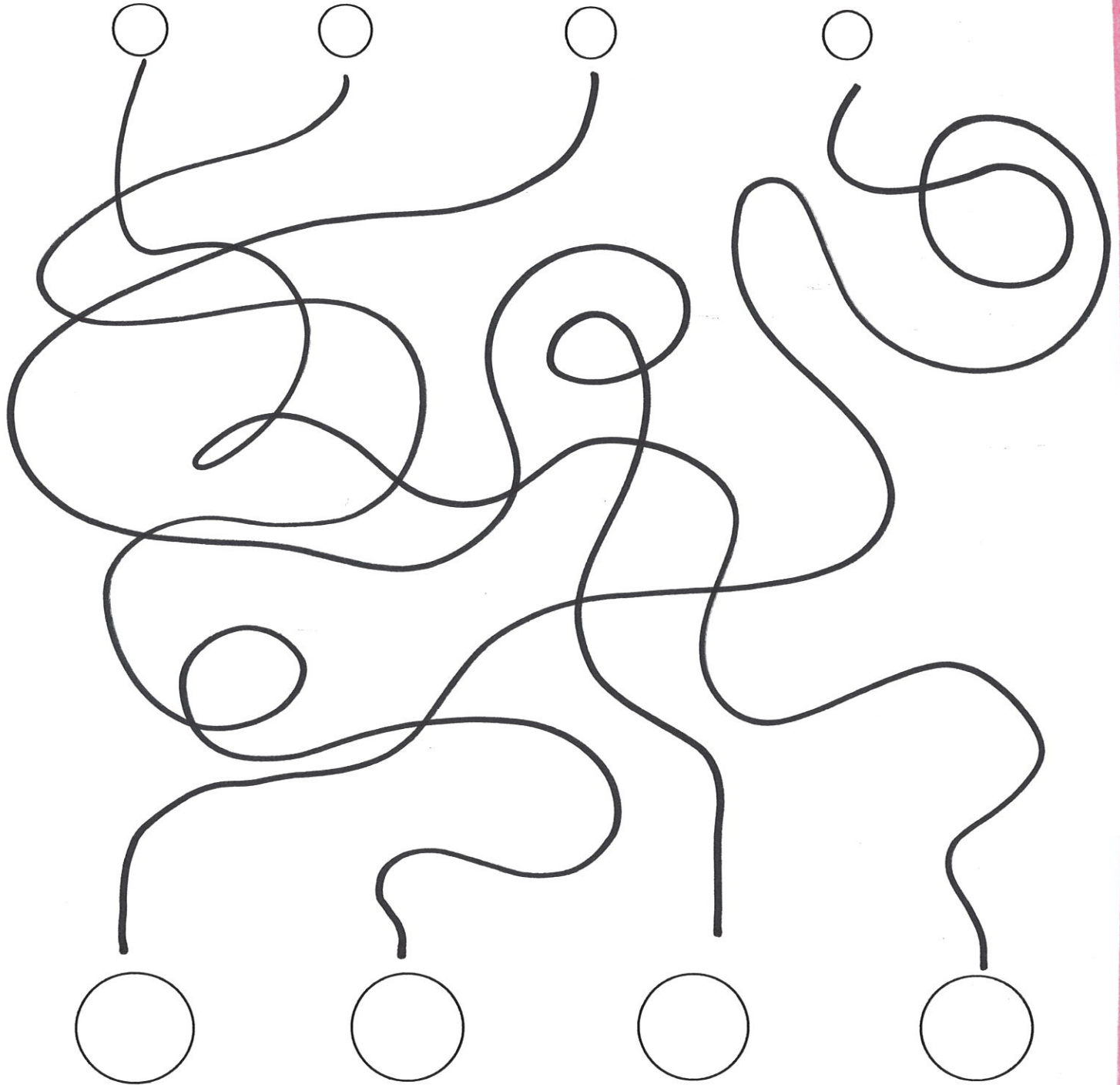
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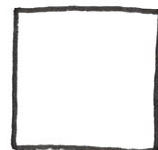
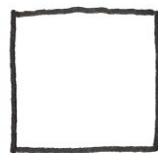
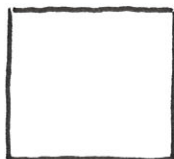
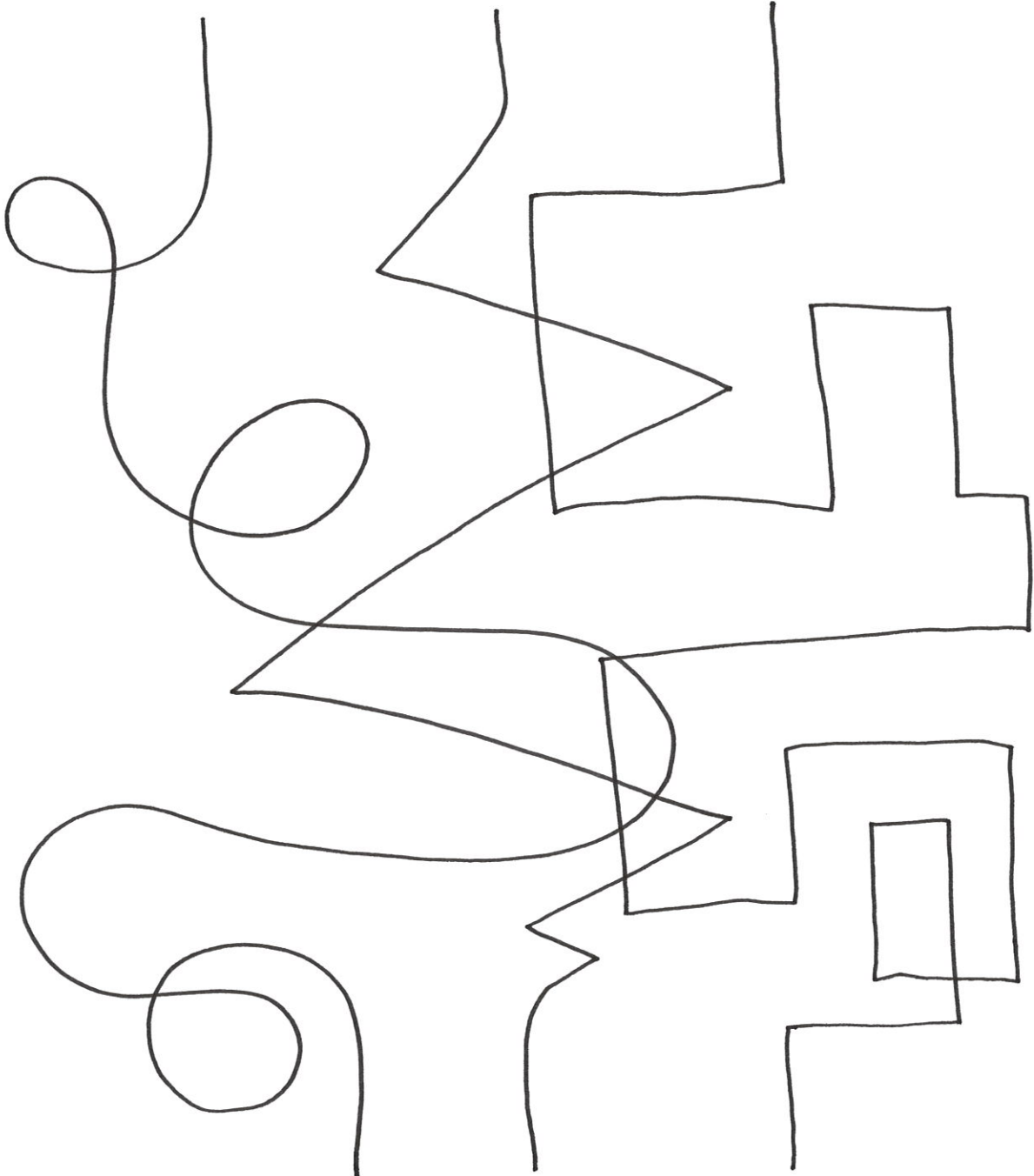
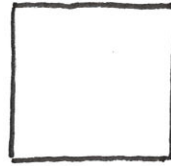
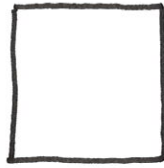
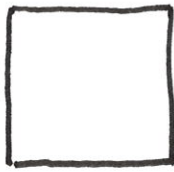


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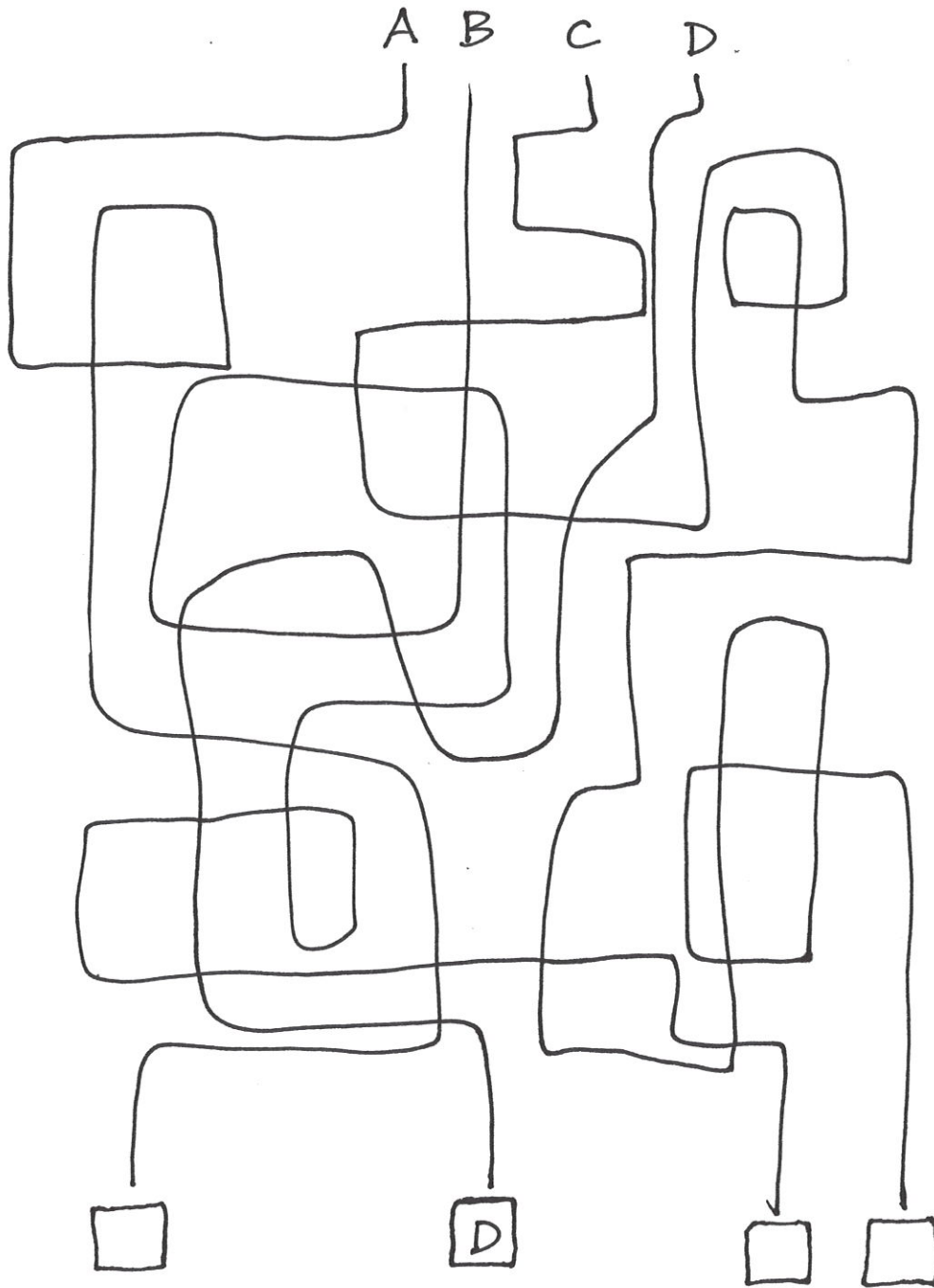


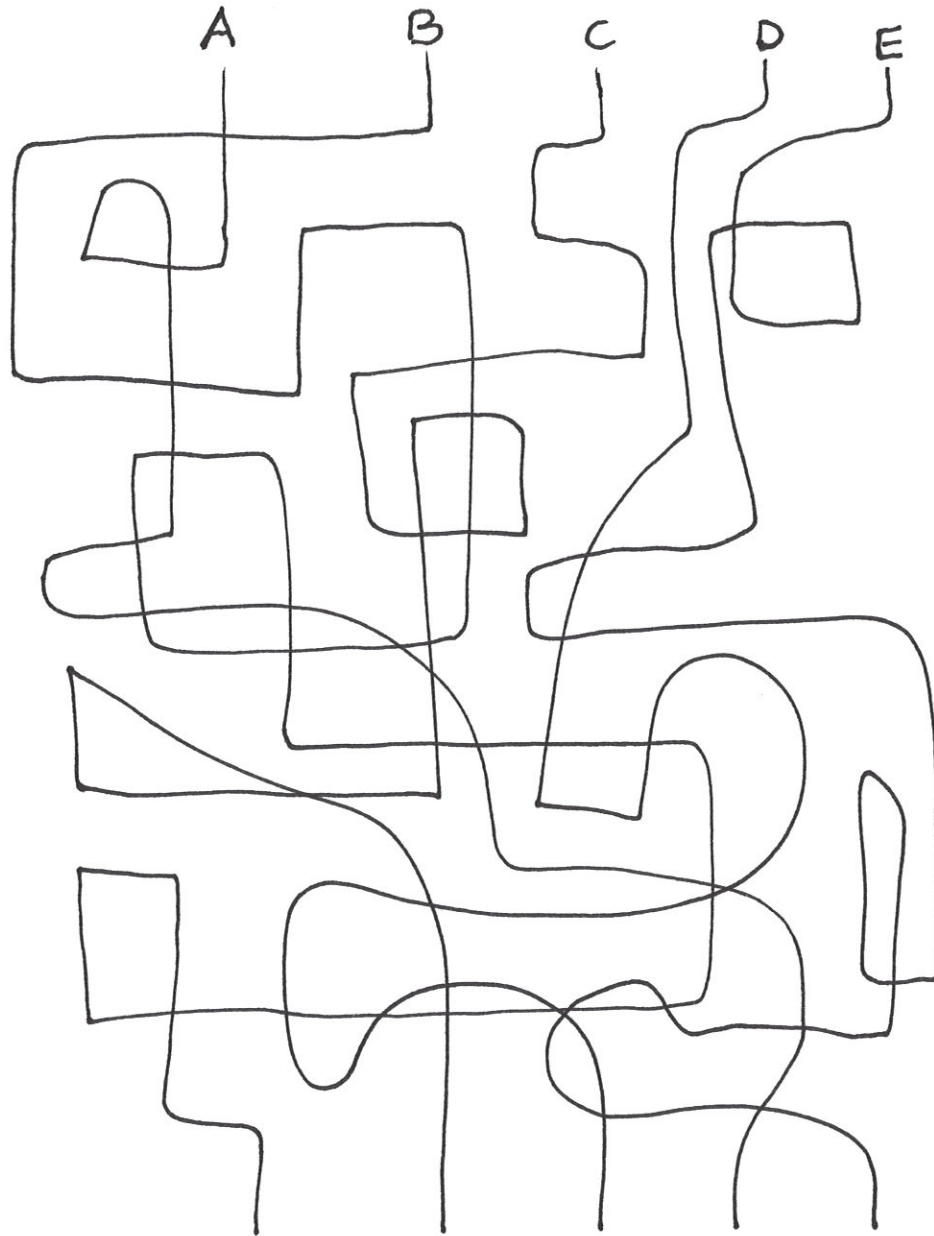
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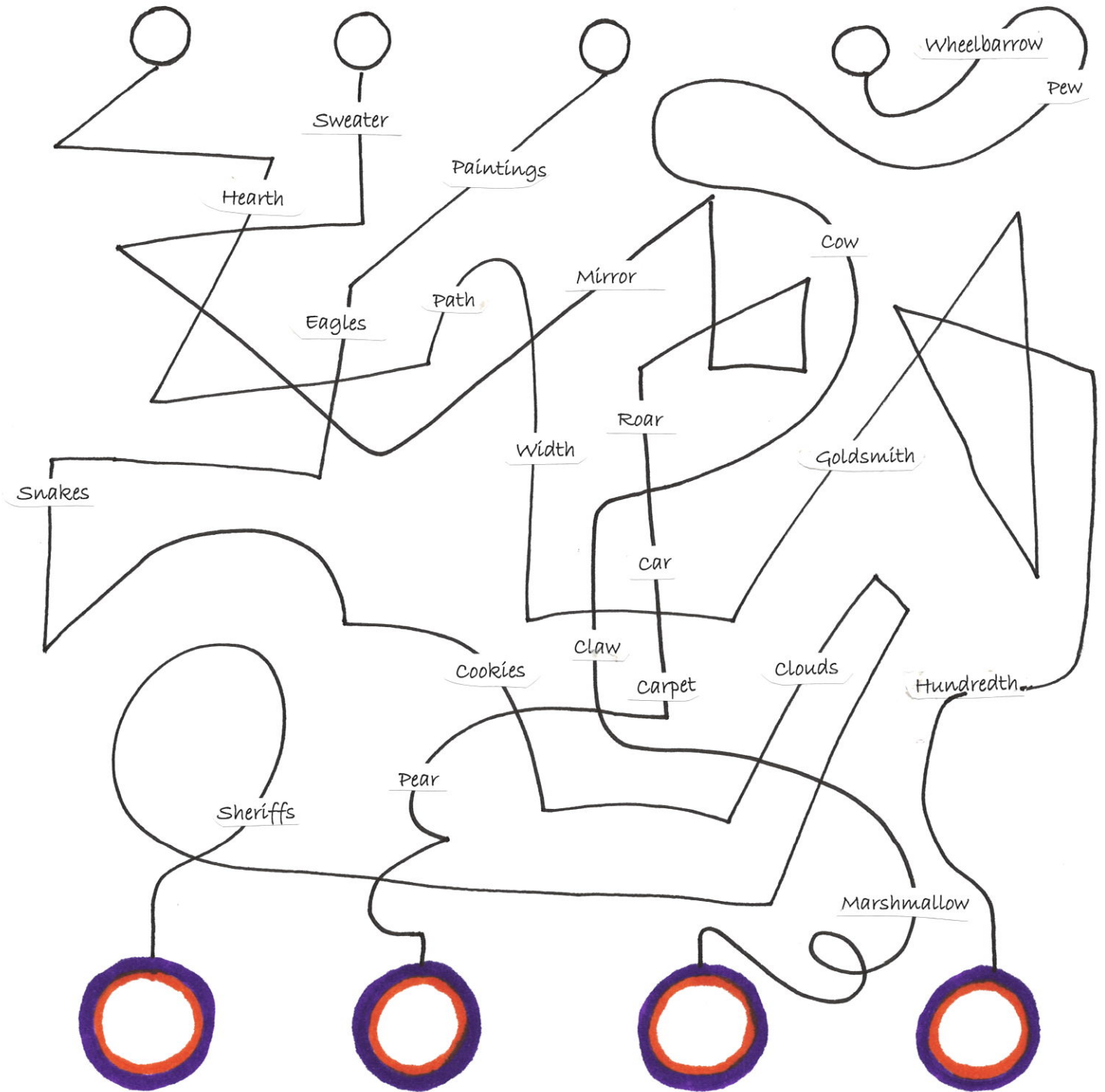


Solve the letter maze.





Use a different colored marker to follow each string. Follow the string down to the bubble and say or write each word you come across on your way. (If the words are too small to see use a magnifying glass.)



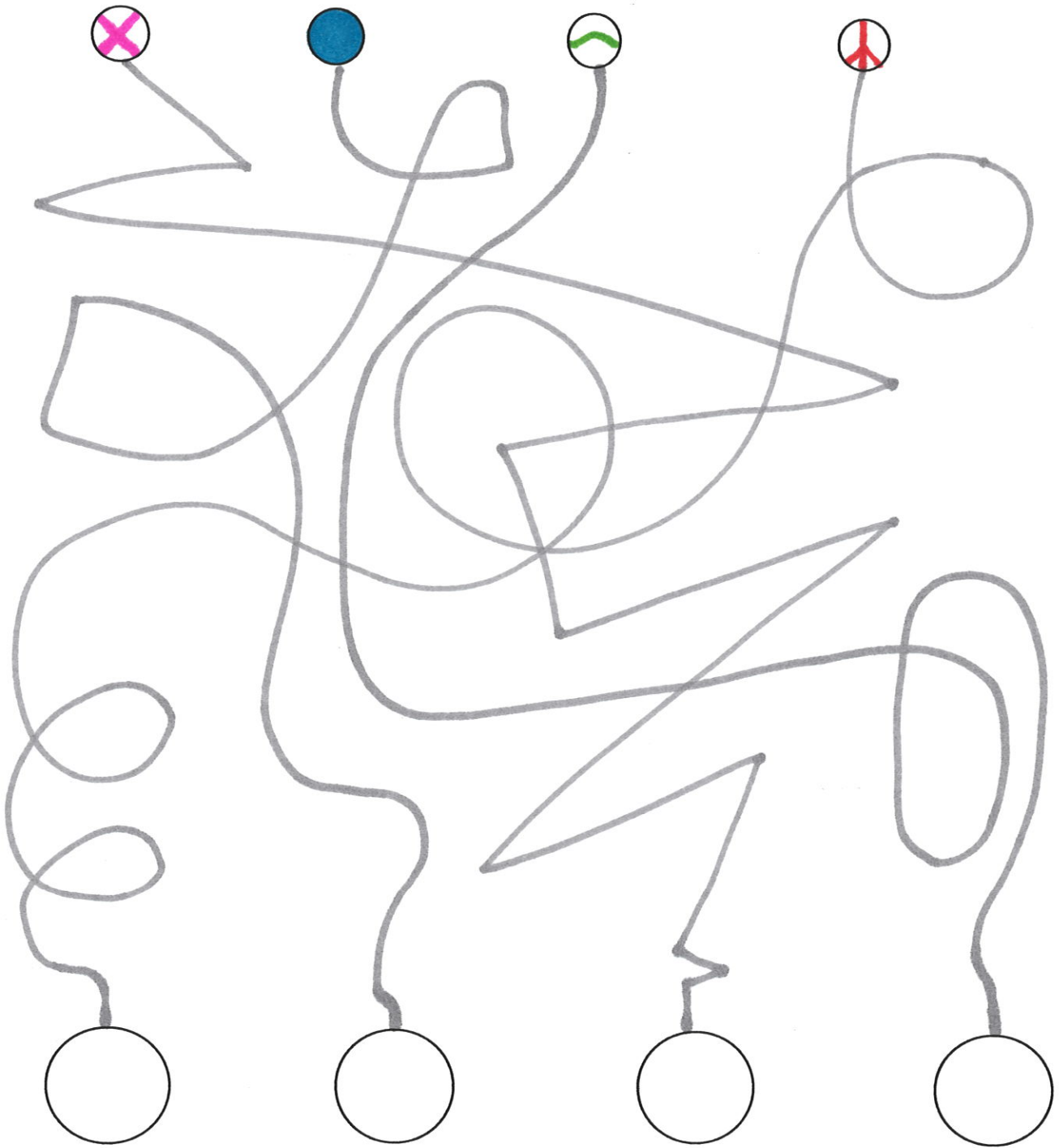
Use a different colored marker for each string. Follow the string down to the correct bubble. Say each word that you come across on your way down.

The maze starts at four points: **(R)**, **(Th)**, **(S)**, and **(W)**. The words encountered along the paths are:

- (R)**: Rat, These, Rodent, That, Water, Rose, Steel, Sit
- (Th)**: Thing, Weed, Sorry, State, Ride, Willing
- (S)**: Snake, Sing, Thick, Thin, Wise
- (W)**: We, Sing, Run, Rain
